In February and March 2020 we ran an online survey for children and young people with SEND to find out more about your experiences of SEND services.


The Results

40% don't have an EHC plan and 10% were not sure




Of the 50% who have an EHC plan

15% said their plan didn't and 30% were not sure




55% said their needs are met at their education provider

32.5% said they aren't and 12.5% were not sure


65% said they receive support with learning

I'm not in school and I'm not learning anything. I want to go to the right school for me but there are no places.

I enjoy school very much and hope when I transfer in two years time there will be good support to help me.
