### 1. Trees planted in 2014/2015

One Tree Per Child engaged with primary schools and the local community to plant 10,065 trees this season. Of the trees, the planted the majority were whips planted in woodland areas or hedges. Trees were upgraded to a standard in 8 instances. Two schools have opted to self-water their trees and one community orchard was upgraded to dwarf stock and is being self-watered by the community group.

The team worked closely with local communities and the Neighbourhood Partnerships on designing the tree plans, planting and where required upgrading the whips to standard size trees.

# 3. OneTree/ TreePips planting events November 2013 to March 2014

We ran 7 events at primary schools and 27 community based events, all of which were attended by primary school children. Each school group received a tree planting workshop whilst planting their tree and named their tree to encourage ownership. We also planted the Big Tree Plant's Millionth Tree in February 2015 at Eastville Park, attended by the Secretary of State for the Environment, Chair of the Forestry Commission and the Director of the Tree Council.

The majority of community planting events were targeting schools as part of the One Tree/TreePips program but individuals, community and corporate groups (including HSBC, Soil Association and Skanska) were very welcome to join the planting.
